Associate, Bachelor's, Master's or Doctoral Program degree in the state of Montana to be eligible. Applicants must provide proof of Montana state residency.

Applications must be postmarked no later than January 8, 2024 to be accepted.

Applicants will be notified in late January of chosen recipients. Recipients of awards agree to publication of their name and photograph to be used for recognition of the award in publications.
